4.4 **Dean's Remarks**

In reference to the coop proposal, securing coop jobs is critical and alumni who are running similar programs have been contacted to participate.

The Faculty is continuing its hiring process, with 8 in Engineering and 6 in Science. Since 2010, we have hired 11 new faculty which accounts for 10% of our faculty compliment.

Enrolment data:

In comparison to the year before, we are doing much better, in particular with first choice.

We will be in a position to establish a "Motion to Create a Faculty of Engineering" on April 5, which will be submitted to APPRC (on that date), then to Senate Executive on April 17<sup>th</sup> and finally to Senate on April 26<sup>th</sup>.

-Town Hall meeting on March 30: "The Future of Science"

This Faculty needs to think ahead to the future of Science and the town hall meeting / forum will be critical to this endeavour. We want feedback as to how faculty see the future of Science. Also, previous deans and associate deans will join J. Kozinski next week to discuss their ideas on the future of Engineering. The end of the town hall meeting will bring clarity with regards to "next steps".

- Upcoming FSE Gala on May 10

Formal invitations are on their way. The event will be held at Casa Loma and attended by external parties from business and government sectors. We want to celebrate the achievements of our colleagues and students at both the international and national level of awards received.

4.5 **Associate Deans' and Bethune Master Remarks**

*J. Amanatides, Master, Bethune College*

- Faculty of Health's initiatives for first-year students

The Faculty of Health is rethinking their relationship with the colleges and having their academic services housed there. Science Academic Services would like to start a pilot project this summer where new student advising takes place in the colleges.

*I. Coe, Associate Dean, Research and Partnerships*

- Delegation to Korea

An article about the delegation was published on YFile today. The workshop will happen later this summer with contacts and institutions visiting York. Updates will be forthcoming.

- York research Chairs

This particular program is still in development with the hope that they will be established this summer. There will be a call at some point, but the timing is uncertain.

- CIGI Chairs  
Notice released recently. 10 chairs will be created.

P. Cribb, Associate Dean, Students

- Update on admissions for the Fall  
Applications are up considerably this year, 13% in choice one.  
The focus is now on conversion and there is a new social blogging website that has been created with students who post regularly to the site: science.yorku.ca/ways  
Faculty members will also be asked to post to the site to discuss their research and teaching focus  
- Status of co-op planning  
Since Chemistry has come onboard, the next steps will be more solid employer outreach possibilities.

- Hiring Update  
There are eight positions in Engineering, one position in Math has been filled and one in Chemistry is very close to closing.

R. Hornsey, Associate Dean, School of Engineering

- Update on the Engineering Building: creation and location  
Over 900 applications received for eight faculty positions now hiring. The location of the future Engineering Tower has been approved and will be situated next to the arboretum parking lot. Construction should begin mid June.  
- Engineering Round Table, save-the-date: April 18  
A workshop/roundtable to discuss the future of Engineering at York will be held on April 18. External participants in various areas of expertise will come and give presentations and entertain questions /discussions.

-A special meeting to discuss CIGI chairs took place  
-Ongoing roundtable discussion with all deans concerning faculties / enrolments  
-An ORU policy has finally been passed and will be forwarded to Senate for approval. Clarity is now brought to the role of Senate and ORUs. Clearer statement on the expectations of ORUs regarding research excellence along with a new category: Organized research service  
-Also, the term has been changed from six to five years. After the five year mark, ORUs are terminated but can reapply
